Janitorial Occupational Training (JOT) Referral partners: • HealthWest • Michigan Rehabilitation Services	Designed to prepare individuals to meet the quality standards of janitorial services, participants gain valuable training combined with paid on-the-job training in a community setting. Participants learn tools and techniques of the field including: safe chemical handling, customer service, floor care, restroom cleaning, kitchen cleaning, trash and recycling, windows and glass, personal safety, and cleaning versus sanitizing.		
Justice Involved Programming (JIP) Referral partners: • Muskegon, Oceana, Mason, Newaygo Co.
